Mr Dominic Doheny, President of the Construction Industry Federation and joint Managing Director of John Flanagan Developments. Dominic will consider the current landscape and potential for the construction industry from the contractor perspective.

Ms Patricia Calleary, Senior Planning Inspector at An Bord Pleanála. Patricia will discuss the planning system in regard to major flooding issues.
